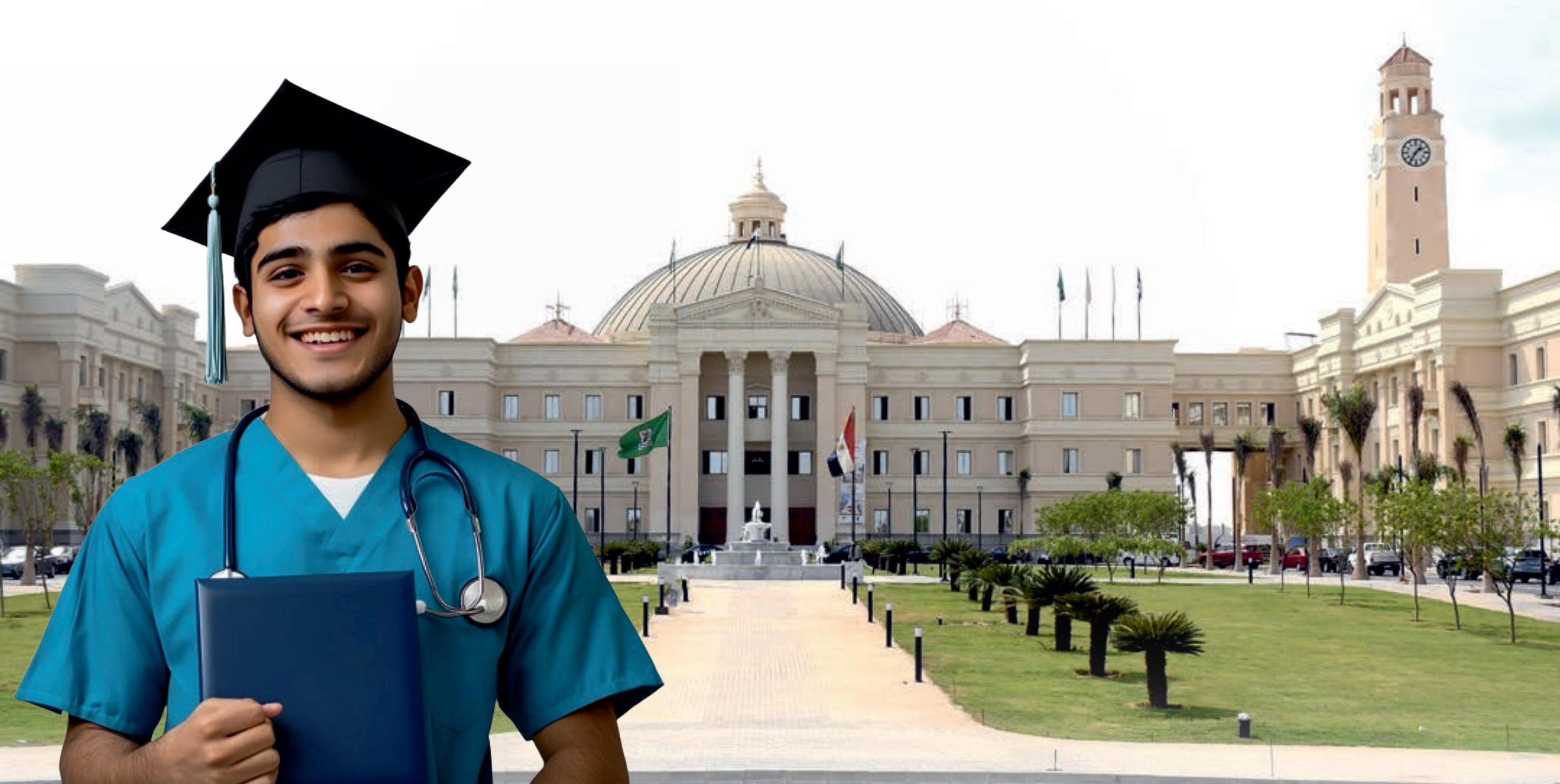

2. Duration of MBBS in Egypt

- 6 years in total
- 5 years of academic study (Pre-clinical and Clinical phases)
- 1-year internship (Practical training in hospitals)

3. Eligibility Criteria for Admission

- Academic Requirements:
- Must have completed 12 years of schooling (High School or equivalent).
- Subjects: Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.
- Minimum required marks: 70-85%, depending on the university.
- For Indian Students:
- NEET qualification is mandatory to study MBBS in Egypt.
- Language Requirement:
- MBBS programs are taught in English, but Arabic may be required for patient interaction during clinical training.

4. Tuition Fees in Egyptian Public Universities

- Annual Fees : \$5,000 – \$8,000 USD (Varies by university).
- Total Cost for 6 Years : \$30,000 – \$48,000 USD.
- Hostel Fees : \$1,000 – \$2,000 USD per year.

5. Admission Process

Cairo University's MBBS program is structured to provide comprehensive medical education over six years, encompassing both theoretical knowledge and practical clinical experience. The curriculum is divided into three main stages:

1. Pre-Clinical Years (Years 1 and 2) :

During the initial phase, students focus on foundational medical sciences, including:

- Anatomy : Study of the human body's structure.
- Histology : Examination of tissues at the microscopic level.
- Biochemistry : Understanding chemical processes within the human body.
- Medical Physiology : Exploration of bodily functions and mechanisms.

This stage establishes a solid base in medical science, preparing students for more advanced topics.

2. Clinical Years (Years 3, 4, and 5):

In this phase, students transition to clinical subjects and gain hands-on experience:

- Pathology: Mechanisms and effects of diseases.
- Microbiology: Study of microorganisms and their impact on health.
- Pharmacology: Effects and uses of drugs in treatment.
- Forensic Medicine: Application of medical knowledge in legal contexts.
- Community Medicine: Public health and preventive medicine.
- Ophthalmology: Eye-related diseases and treatments.
- Pediatrics: Medical care for infants, children, and adolescents.
- Obstetrics & Gynecology: Women's reproductive health and childbirth.
- Surgery: Principles and practices of surgical procedures.

Students participate in clinical rotations across various hospital departments, applying their knowledge in real-world settings.

3. Internship (Year 6) :

The final year is dedicated to an internship, offering immersive clinical experience:

- Rotations: Students rotate through key specialties such as Internal Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynecology, and Emergency Medicine.
- Responsibilities: Under supervision, interns engage in patient diagnosis, treatment planning, and management.

This year is crucial for consolidating clinical skills and preparing for independent medical practice.
